## The Liturgy of the Word

Lector: Our first reading is from the book of Genesis

Genesis 2:18-24

<sup>18</sup> And the Lord God said: 'It is not good that the man should be alone; I will make him a help meet for him.' <sup>19</sup> And out of the ground the Lord God formed every beast of the field, and every fowl of the air; and brought them unto the man to see what he would call them; and whatsoever the man would call every living creature, that was to be the name thereof. <sup>20</sup> And the man gave names to all cattle, and to the fowl of the air, and to every beast of the field; but for Adam there was not found a help mate for him.

<sup>21</sup> And the Lord God caused a deep sleep to fall upon the man, and he slept; and He took one of his ribs and closed up the place with flesh instead thereof. <sup>22</sup> And the rib, which the Lord God had taken from the man, made He a woman, and brought her unto the man. <sup>23</sup> And the man said: 'This is now bone of my bones, and flesh of my flesh; she shall be called Woman, because she was taken out of Man.' <sup>24</sup> Therefore shall a man leave his father and his mother, and shall cleave unto his wife, and they shall be one flesh.

Psalm Leader: Our Psalm Response to this reading is Psalm 26. Psalm 261 begins on page 616 in the Book of Common Prayer. Let us pray the psalm responsively by whole verse.

- 1 Give judgment for me, O LORD, for I have lived with integrity; \* I have trusted in the Lord and have not faltered.
- 2 Test me, O LORD, and try me; \* examine my heart and my mind.
- 3 For your love is before my eyes; \* I have walked faithfully with you.

- 4 I have not sat with the worthless, \* nor do I consort with the deceitful.
- 5 I have hated the company of evildoers; \* I will not sit down with the wicked.
- 6 I will wash my hands in innocence, O LORD, \* that I may go in procession round your altar,
- 7 Singing aloud a song of thanksgiving \* and recounting all your wonderful deeds.
- 8 LORD, I love the house in which you dwell \* and the place where your glory abides.
- 9 Do not sweep me away with sinners, \* nor my life with those who thirst for blood,
- 10 Whose hands are full of evil plots, \* and their right hand full of bribes.
- 11 As for me, I will live with integrity; \* redeem me, O LORD, and have pity on me.
- 12 My foot stands on level ground; \* in the full assembly I will bless the LORD.

Lector: The second reading is from the letter to the Hebrews 1:1-4; 2:5-12

<sup>1.1</sup> In many ways and by many means, God spoke in ancient times to our ancestors through the prophets, <sup>2</sup> but at the end of these days he spoke to us in a son.

God appointed son to be the heir of all things:

Through him, in addition, he created the worlds.

 $^{3}$  The son is the shining reflection of God's own glory,

the precise expression of God's own very being:

He sustains all things through his powerful word.

He accomplished the cleansing needed for sins,

And sat down at the right of the Majesty Supreme.

4 See how much greater he is than the angels:

The name that he was granted was finer than theirs.

<sup>5</sup> You see, God did not place the world that is to come (which is what I am writing about) under the control of angels. <sup>6</sup> Someone has spoken of it in these terms:

What are humans that you should remember them?

What is the son of man, that you should take thought for him?

<sup>7</sup> You made him a little lower than the angels,

You crowned the human with glory and honor.

8 And you placed everything under his feet.

When it speaks of everything being subjected to him, it leaves nothing that is not subjected to him. As things are right now, though we did not see everything subjected to him. What we do see is the one who was for a little while, made lower than the angels – that is, Jesus – crowned with glory and honor because of the suffering of death, so that by God's grace he might taste death on behalf of everyone.

<sup>10</sup> This is how it works out. Everything exists for the sake of God and because of him and it was appropriate that, in bringing many children to glory, he should make perfect, though suffering, the one who leads the way to salvation. <sup>11</sup> For the one who makes others holy, and the ones who are made holy, all belong to a single family. This is why he is not ashamed to call them his brothers and sisters when he says,

<sup>12</sup> I will announce your name to my brothers and sisters.
I will praise your name in the middle of the assembly.



A reading from the Good News according to Mark

Mark 10:2-16

## All: Glory to you, Lord Christ.

<sup>2</sup> Some Pharisees approached Jesus with a question. "Is it permitted," they asked, "for a man to divorce his wife?" <sup>4</sup> They said, "Moses allowed a man to write a divorce certificate and to divorce his wife?" They said this to trap him. <sup>3</sup> "Well," answered Jesus, "what did Moses command you?"

4 "Moses permitted us," they replied, "to write a notice of separation and so to complete the divorce." 5 "He gave you that command," said Jesus, "because you are hard-hearted. 6 But from the beginning of creation

'male and female he made them; <sup>7</sup> and that is why the man must leave his father and his mother and cleave unto his wife; <sup>8</sup> so that the two shall become one flesh.'

"There you are, then; they are no longer two, but one flesh. 9 What God has joined, humans must not split up."

When they were back indoors, the disciples asked him about this. <sup>11</sup> "Anyone who divorces his wife," said Jesus, "and marries someone else commits adultery against her. <sup>12</sup> And if a wife divorces her husband and marries someone else, she commits adultery."

<sup>13</sup> People brought children to Jesus for him to touch them. The disciples reprimanded them. <sup>14</sup> But Jesus was angry when he saw it, and said to them, "Let the children come to me! Do not stop them! The kingdom of God belongs to people like that. <sup>15</sup> I am telling you the truth; anyone who doesn't receive the kingdom of God like

a child will never get into it." <sup>16</sup> And Jesus hugged them, laid his hands on them, and blessed them.

Nicene Creed - BCP 358

Priest: The Lord be with you.

All: And also with you.

Priest: Lift up your hearts.

All: We lift them to the Lord.

Priest: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

All: It is right to give him thanks and praise.

Priest: God of all power, Ruler of the Universe, you are worthy of glory and praise.

All: Glory to you for ever and ever.

Priest: At your command all things came to be: the vast expanse of interstellar space,

galaxies, suns, the planets in their courses, and this fragile earth, our island

home.

All: By your will they were created and have their being.

Priest: From the primal elements you brought forth the human race, and blessed us

with memory, reason, and skill. You made us the rulers of creation. But we turned against you and betrayed your trust; and we turned against one another.

All: Have mercy, Lord, for we are sinners in your sight.

Priest: Again and again, you called us to return. Through prophets and sages you

through Christ our Lord. Amen.


