




The little church near the light, sharing the Light






Priest: Blessed be God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

The Liturgy of the Word

<u>OT Lector</u>: The first reading is from the prophet Isaiah

Isaiah 62:1-5

^{62.1} For Zion's sake I will not keep silent, and for Jerusalem's sake I will not keep quiet, until her righteousness goes forth like brightness, and her salvation like a torch that is burning. ² The nations will see your righteousness, and all kings your glory; And you will be called by a new name which the mouth of the Lord will designate.

³ You will also be a crown of beauty in the hand of the Lord, and a royal headband in the hand of your God. ⁴ It will no longer be said to you, "Forsaken," nor to your land will it any longer be said, "Desolate". But you will be called, "My delight is in her," and your land, "Married." For the Lord delights in you, and to Him your land will be married.

⁵ For as a young man marries a virgin, so your sons will marry you, and as the groom rejoices over the bride, so your God will rejoice over you.

This is the Word of the Lord.

OT Lector: We will pray verses 5 through 10 of Psalm 36 as our response to this reading. We will pray these verses responsively by half verse.

5	Your love, O LORD, reaches to the heavens, * and your faithfulness to the clouds.
6	Your righteousness is like the strong mountains, your justice like the great deep; * you save both man and beast, O LORD.
7	How priceless is your love, O God! * your people take refuge under the shadow of your wings.
8	They feast upon the abundance of your house; * you give them drink from the river of your delights.
9	For with you is the well of life, * and in your light we see light.
10	Continue your loving-kindness to those who know you, * and your favor to those who are true of heart.

NT Lector: The second reading is from the first letter of Paul to the Corinthians

1 Cor. 12:1-11

^{12.1} Brothers and sisters, I do not want you to be ignorant about spiritual gifts. ² You know that when you were Gentiles you were often misled by false gods that can't even speak. ³So I want to make it clear to you that no one says, "Jesus is cursed!" when speaking by God's Spirit, and no one can say, "Jesus is Lord," except by the Holy Spirit. ⁴ There are different spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; ⁵ and there are different ministries and the same Lord; ⁶ and there are different activities but the same God who produces all of them in


everyone. ⁷ A demonstration of the Spirit is given to each person for the common good. ⁸ A word of wisdom is given by the Spirit to one person, a word of knowledge to another according to the same Spirit, ⁹ faith to still another by the same Spirit, gifts of healing to another in the one Spirit, ¹⁰ performance of miracles to another, prophecy to another, the ability to tell spirits apart to another, different kinds of tongues to another, and the interpretation of the tongues to another. ¹¹ All these things are produced by the one and same Spirit who gives what he wants to each person.

<u>Celebrant</u>: The Holy Gospel of Jesus Christ according to John John 2:1-11

All: Glory to you, Lord Christ

^{2.1} On the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee. Jesus' mother was there, and ²Jesus and his disciples were also invited to the celebration. ³When the wine ran out, Jesus' mother said to him, "They do not have any wine." ⁴Jesus replied, "Woman, what does that have to do with me? My time has not come yet."

⁵His mother told the servants, "Do whatever he tells you." ⁶Nearby were six stone water jars used for the Jewish cleansing ritual, each able to hold about twenty or thirty gallons.

⁷ Jesus said to the servants, "Fill the jars with water," and they filled them to the brim. ⁸ Then he told them, "Now draw some from them and take it to the headwaiter," and they did. ⁹ The headwaiter tasted the water that had become wine. He didn't know where it came from, though the servants who had drawn the water knew.

The headwaiter called the groom ¹⁰ and said, "Everyone serves the good wine first. They bring out the second-rate wine only when the guests are drinking freely. You kept the good wine until now." ¹¹ This was the first miraculous sign that Jesus did in Cana of Galilee. He revealed his glory, and his disciples believed in him.

This is the Gospel of the Lord.







We will pray Eucharistic Prayer B during the Epiphany season. It is found on page 367 in the BCP



It is right and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth. Because in the mystery of the Word made flesh, you have caused a new light to shine in our hearts, to give the knowledge of your glory in the face of your son Jesus Christ our Lord.

Therefore we praise you, joining our voices with Angels and Archangels, and with all the company of heaven, who for ever sing this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name:





Priest: We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus, your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

On the night before he died for us, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore, according to his command, O Father,

All: We remember his death, We proclaim his resurrection, We await his coming in glory.

Priest: And we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, O Lord of all; presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine.

We pray you, gracious God, to send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts that they may be the Sacrament of the Body of Christ and his Blood of the new Covenant. Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice, that we may be acceptable through him, being sanctified by the Holy Spirit. In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us to that heavenly country where, with all your saints, we may enter the everlasting heritage of your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation.

By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever.

All: Amen.


We will use the contemporary form of the Lord's Prayer, found on page 364 in the BCP
