





The Liturgy of the Word

OT Lector: The first reading is from the prophet Isaiah

Isaiah 65:17-25

- ¹⁷ Look! I am creating a new heaven and a new earth: past events will not be remembered; they will not come to mind.
- ¹⁸ Be glad and rejoice forever in what I'm creating, because I'm creating Jerusalem as a joy and her people as a source of gladness.
- ¹⁹I will rejoice in Jerusalem and be glad about my people.

 No one will ever hear the sound of weeping or crying in it again.
- ²⁰ No more will babies live only a few days, or the old fail to live out their days.

The one who dies at a hundred will be like a young person, and the one falling short of a hundred will seem cursed.

- ²¹ They will build houses and live in them; they will plant vineyards and eat their fruit.
- 22 They will not build for others to live in, nor plant for others to eat.Like the days of a tree will be the days of my people; my chosen will make full use of their handiwork.
- ²³ They will not labor in vain, nor bear children to a world of horrors, because they will be people blessed by the LORD, they along with their descendants.
- ²⁴ Before they call, I will answer; while they are still speaking, I will hear.
- Wolf and lamb will graze together, and the lion will eat straw like the ox, but the snake—its food will be dust. They will not hurt or destroy at any place on my holy mountain, says the LORD.

OT Lector: We will pray verses 1 – 2 and 14 – 24 of Psalm 118 as our response to this reading. Psalm 118 begins on page 760 in the BCP. We will pray these verses responsively by half verse.

- Give thanks to the LORD, for he is good; * his mercy endures for ever.
- Let Israel now proclaim, *"His mercy endures for ever."
- 14 The LORD is my strength and my song, * and he has become my salvation.
- There is a sound of exultation and victory * in the tents of the righteous:
- 16 "The right hand of the LORD has triumphed! *
 the right hand of the LORD is exalted!
 the right hand of the LORD has triumphed!"

- 17 I shall not die, but live, * and declare the works of the LORD.
- 18 The LORD has punished me sorely, * but he did not hand me over to death.
- Open for me the gates of righteousness; *

 I will enter them; I will offer thanks to the LORD.
- 20 "This is the gate of the LORD; * he who is righteous may enter."
- 21 I will give thanks to you, for you answered me * and have become my salvation.
- The same stone which the builders rejected * has become the chief cornerstone.
- This is the LORD'S doing, * and it is marvelous in our eyes.
- On this day the LORD has acted; * we will rejoice and be glad in it.

³⁴ Peter took a deep breath and began.

"It has become clear to me," he said, "that God really does not show favoritism.

35 Rather, in every race and nation, people who fear God and do what is right are acceptable to God. 36 God sent his word to the children of Israel, announcing peace through Jesus Christ – he is Lord of all! 37 You know all about this, and how the word spread through all Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism John proclaimed.

³⁸ God anointed this man, Jesus of Nazareth, with the holy spirit and with power. Jesus went about doing good and healing all who were overpowered by the devil, since God was with him. ³⁹ We are witnesses of everything he did in the land of Judea and in Jerusalem. They killed him by hanging him on a tree, ⁴⁰ but God raised him on the third day, and allowed him to be seen, ⁴¹ not by everyone but by those of us whom God had appointed beforehand. We ate and drank with him after he had been raised from the dead. ⁴² And God commanded us to announce to the people, and to bear witness, that Jesus is the one appointed by God to be judge of the living and the dead. ⁴³ All the prophets give their witness: Jesus is the one! Everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name."

24 The women went to the tomb in the very early morning of the first day of the week, carrying the spices they had prepared. ² They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, ³ and when they went in, they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus.

⁴ As they were at a loss what to make of it all, suddenly two men in shining clothese stood beside them. ⁵ The women were terrified, and bowed their faces toward the ground. But the men said to them, "Why look for the living with the dead? ⁶ He is not here – he has been raised! Do you not remember? While you were still in Galilee he told you that ⁷ the son of man must be handed over into the hands of sinners, and be crucified, and rise again on the third day." ⁸ And then they remembered his words.

⁹They went back, away from the tomb, and told all this to the eleven and all the others. ¹⁰ It was Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the others with them. They said this to the apostles; ¹¹ Their words seemed to the apostles as stupid, useless talk, and they did not believe them.

¹² Peter, though, got up and ran to the tomb. He stooped down and saw only the grave-clothes. He went back home, perplexed at what had happened.

This is the Gospel of the Lord, the Good News of our salvation.

Celebrant: Do you reaffirm your renunciation of evil and renew your commitment to Jesus

Christ?

People: I do.

Celebrant: Do you believe in God the Father?

People: I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Celebrant: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

People: I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord.

He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit

and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried.

He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again.

He ascended into heaven,

and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Celebrant: Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

People: I believe in the Holy Spirit,

the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins,

the resurrection of the body,

and the life everlasting.

People: I will, with God's help.

Celebrant: Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of

every human being?

People: I will, with God's help.

May Almighty God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has given us a new birth by water and the Holy Spirit, and bestowed upon us the forgiveness of sins,





We are praying Eucharistic Prayer B during this Easter Season. It begins page 367 in the BCP.



But chiefly are we bound to praise you for the glorious resurrection of your Son Jesus Christ our Lord; For he is the true Paschal Lamb, who was sacrificed for us, and has taken away the sin of the world. But his death he has destroyed death, and by his rising to life again, he has won for us everlasting life. Therefore we praise you, joining our voices with Angels and Archangels, and with all the company of heaven, who for ever sing this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name:



Priest:

We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus, your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

On the night before he died for us, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore, according to his command, O Father,

All: We remember his death,
We proclaim his resurrection,
We await his coming in glory.

Priest: And we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, O Lord of all; presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine.

We pray you, gracious God, to send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts that they may be the Sacrament of the Body of Christ and his Blood of the new Covenant. Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice, that we may be acceptable through him, being sanctified by the Holy Spirit. In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us to that heavenly country where, with all your saints, we may enter the everlasting heritage of your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation.

By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever.
