

The Liturgy of the Word

OT Lector: The first reading is from the book Second Kings

2 Kings 2:1 - 14

<sup>1</sup>When the Lord was about to take Elijah up to heaven by a whirlwind, Elijah and Elisha were on their way from Gilgal. <sup>2</sup> Elijah said to Elisha, "Stay here; for the LORD has sent me as far as Bethel." But Elisha said, "As the LORD lives, and as you yourself live, I will not leave you." <sup>3</sup> Disciples of the prophets at Bethel came to Elisha and said to him, "Do you know that the LORD will take your master away from you today?" He replied, "I know it, too; be silent."

<sup>4</sup>Then Elijah said to him, "Elisha, stay here, for the LORD has sent me on to Jericho." But Elisha said, "As the LORD lives, and as you yourself live, I will not leave you." So, they went down to Jericho. <sup>5</sup> Disciples of the prophets at Jericho came to Elisha and said to him, "Do you know that the LORD will take your master away from you today?" He replied, "I know it, too; be silent."

<sup>6</sup> Then Elijah said to him, "Stay here; for the LORD has sent me on to the Jordan." But he said, "As the LORD lives, and as you yourself live, I will not leave you." So, the two of them went on. <sup>7</sup> Fifty men of the disciples of the prophets followed and stood at some distance from them as they stood by the Jordan. <sup>8</sup> Thereupon Elijah took his mantle and, rolling it up, he struck the water. The water parted to the right and the left, so that the two of them crossed over on dry ground.

<sup>9</sup> As they were crossing, Elijah said to Elisha, "Tell me, what can I do for you before I am taken from you." Elisha answered, "Let a double share of your spirit pass on to me." <sup>10</sup> "You have asked a hard thing," Ellijah responded. If you see me as I am being taken from you, this will be granted to you; if not, it will not." <sup>11</sup> As they continued walking and talking, a fiery chariot of fire with fiery horses appeared and separated one from the other, and Elijah went up to heaven in a whirlwind. <sup>12</sup> Elisha saw it, and he cried out, "Oh, father, father! Israel's chariots and horsemen!" But when he could no longer see him, he grasped his own garments and tore them in two.

<sup>13</sup> Elisha picked up Elijah's mantle, which had fallen from him, and went back and stood on the bank of the Jordan. <sup>14</sup> Taking the mantle that had fallen from Elijah, he struck the water and said, "Where is the LORD, the God of Elijah?" As he too struck the water, it parted to the right and to the left, and Elisha crossed over.

I refused to be comforted.

11 I will remember the works of the Lord, \*

and call to mind your wonders of old time.

<sup>12</sup> I will meditate on all your acts \*

and ponder your mighty deeds.

13 Your way, O God, is holy; \*

who is so great a god as our God?

14 You are the God who works wonders \*

and have declared your power among the peoples.

<sup>15</sup> By your strength you have redeemed your people, \*

NT Lector: A reading is from Paul's letter to the Christians in Galatia Galatians 5:1, 13-25

<sup>1</sup> Jesus set us free so that we could enjoy freedom! So stand firm and do not get yourselves tied down by the chains of slavery.

<sup>13</sup> When God called you, my dear family, he called you to make you free. But you must not use your freedom as an opportunity for self-indulgence. Rather, you must become each other's servants through love. <sup>14</sup> For the whole law is summed up in a single commandment, this one: "Love your neighbor as yourself." <sup>15</sup> But if you bite and devour one another, watch out! You may end up being destroyed by each other.

<sup>16</sup> Let me say this to you: Live by the Spirit, and you will not do what the flesh wants you to do. <sup>17</sup> For the flesh wants to go against the Spirit, and the Spirit against the flesh. They are opposed to each other, to prevent you from doing what you want. <sup>18</sup> But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not subject to the law.

<sup>19</sup> Now the works of the flesh are obvious: they are such things as fornication, impurity, licentiousness, <sup>20</sup> idolatry, sorcery, hostilities, strife, jealousy, bursts of rage, selfish ambition, divisions, factions, <sup>21</sup> envy, drunkenness, wild partying, and similar things. I have told you before and I am telling you again. Those who do such things will not inherit the kingdom of God.

<sup>22</sup> But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, great heartedness, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, <sup>23</sup> gentleness, and self-control. There is no law against such things. <sup>24</sup> And those who belong to Jesus the Messiah have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. <sup>25</sup> If we live by the Spirit, let us also be guided by the Spirit.





Celebrant:

# To Partake of Communion or to Receive a Blessing

Those who wish to partake of Holy Communion may come to the altar rail. The railing is our way of extending the Lord's table. If you wish to receive only a blessing, cross your arms over your chest.

<u>If you prefer a wafer to a small piece of bread</u>, please hold your hands out but facing your hands toward the floor.

<u>If you need a gluten free host</u>, please place your right hand on your left shoulder.


<u>To receive only the communion bread</u>, consume the host after it is in your hands; then return to your pew.

If you wish to receive communion bread and dip it in the consecrated wine, remain at the altar rail, and hold the bread or host in your hand until the gold chalice comes to you. Then dip the host into the wine and consume the communion bread and wine.

If you wish to consume the host and then sip from the chalice, leave the altar rail after you consume the bread or host and move to the Eucharistic Minister with the silver sipping chalice at the left side of the altar rail.

Always, you may either stand or kneel at the altar rail, as you prefer.


